- 4 Teachers have then selected random programme and course outcome topics. Students of the Department are supposed to achieve those outcomes.
- 4 Teachers have evaluated the level of understanding of the students on the basis of the randomly selected topics.
- ♣ Evaluation process has been conducted on the basis of four grades Grade A: Excellent, Grade B: Good, Grade C: Satisfactory and D: Poor.

Report of the Evaluation

We evaluated total Twenty Five students randomly selected from English department. Teachers gave them grades from A, B, C and D on the basis of their level of attainment of programme and course outcomes. It has been found that more than fifty percent of the students have scored excellent, another

Twenty-eight percent students have been evaluated as good and another Twenty percent students have been evaluated as satisfactory. No student was found in the "poor" category.
